2022 marks the 40th anniversary of the Episcopal Community Foundation for Middle and North Georgia (founded as the Episcopal Charities foundation at the 75th Annual Council in 1982). Over the past 40 years we have provided more than \$5.4 million in grant funding to our Episcopal parishes and their nonprofit partners working with people experiencing poverty and oppression throughout the Diocese of Atlanta, and we are honored to continue this work through the generous support of Episcopalians throughout Middle and North Georgia!
