
## A NOTE FROM OUR ED

## RECORD-BREAKING 2018 HUNGER WALK RUN!

On February 25, 2018, ECF partnered with the Atlanta Community Food Bank and local faith organizations for the 34th Annual Hunger Walk Run. St. Paul's (Atlanta) won the Bishop's Cup by raising a whopping \$10,931! Special recognition goes to St. Bartholomew's who came in a close second at \$8,805, and the following parishes who each raised more than \$1,000 to fight hunger in our Diocese: Church of Our Saviour, St. James (Clayton), St. Catherine's, Church of the Epiphany, Christ Episcopal Church (Norcross), Emmanuel Episcopal Church, Church of the Holy Comforter, and St. Michael & All Angels. ## ECF LAUNCHES INNOVATIVE LEGACY GIVING PROGRAM FOR PARISHES

In 2018, ECF launched its new legacy giving program for parishes. More than a dozen parishes throughout our Diocese have already requested ECF's dedicated support, which includes:

- Administrative and fundraising support for your parishioners to establish a lasting legacy gift that benefits both your parish specifically, as well as the poor and oppressed throughout the Diocese.
- Planned giving and financial planning experts on our Board of Directors who are specifically charged with creating and managing the tools necessary for legacy giving success.

Donors from across the Diocese of Atlanta can contribute their funds to ECF (either in life or upon their passing). When the gift matures, a disbursement(s) will be made back to the donor's parish based on the donor's wishes. The power of this model is that we can invest and manage these pooled funds much more easily (and at a higher rate of return) than all the individual parishes could do on their own.
