Episcopal Parishes Join 40th Anniversary Hunger Walk Run on March 10

- Announces grant with funds raised at 2023 Hunger Walk Run -

Atlanta, GA, January 9, 2024 — On March 10, 2024, the Episcopal Community Foundation for Middle and North Georgia (ECF) will partner with the Atlanta Community Food Bank and local faith organizations for the 40th Annual Hunger Walk Run. Episcopalians will walk, run, and raise funds to fight hunger in Georgia. "We are thrilled to celebrate this year's milestone Hunger Walk Run and the commitment that the parishes of the Episcopal Diocese of Atlanta have consistently shown towards ending hunger," said Lindsey Hardegree, ECF's Executive Director.

Recently, ECF provided a grant of \$21,500 to SafeHouse Ministries in Elberton. This grant was made possible through funds generously donated as a part of the 2023 Hunger Walk Run event which took place on March 12, 2023. SafeHouse Ministries, in partnership with St. Alban's Episcopal Church (Elberton), will use this capital funding towards renovating their space to accommodate a walk-in freezer, significantly increasing their capacity to provide meat and produce as a part of their food distribution services.
